Ron Tibbett's **Legacy**

Poet, journalist, filmmaker, Ron Tibbett, was born in Chicago in 1941. After moving to West Point, MS with his wife Dr. Charlotte Magnussen in the early '90s, Tibbett made the film "Swept Off My Feet". While looking for festivals to submit the film, Tibbett found that there were none in Mississippi. In 1997 he founded The Magnolia Independent Film Festival and gave rise to what would become a independent thrivina film festival community and indie filmmaker scene within Mississippi.

One film submission to The Mag impressed Tibbett so much that he and the director, Bill Brown set off to make a film together. That film was "Buffalo Common." Directed by Brown and produced by Tibbett, "Buffalo Common" is a subconscious road trip through the forgotten missile silos of North Dakota. The film was an official selection of the 2003 Sundance Film Festival and made the Village Voice's Top Ten Avant-Garde list. Later, Ron directed the film, "Citizen Shane." This documentary tells the story of a 22-year-old man's hilarious and touching campaign for sheriff of Lowndes County who ran on a pro-pornography/pro-civil liberties ticket. To Ron, this was a very personal story, and at its heart, the film is about how this kid deals with his mother's death. The film slowly became an underground success.

Sadly, Ron Tibbett lost his life in a car accident not far from home in 2004. He left a legacy that went beyond just his films. His legacy is 25 years in the making and thrives through an entire film community born out of his desire to bring independent cinema to Mississippi and nurture filmmakers both locally and abroad.

Jared Hollingsworth is a Mississippi native and currently lives in the city of Hattiesburg. He is an instructor of Media and Entertainment Arts, Video Arts at the University of Southern Mississippi. His background and experience are primarily in post-production, editorial and color. He has been the editor and/or colorist on multiple Mississippi independent films and provided remote services for other projects. In 2020, Jared won a Gold Telly Award for his editing on the short film, Doodle and in 2022, a Silver Telly Award for editing the official trailer for the feature film Demigod.

MEET THE JUDGES

She has continued to study film and acting independently, including a shortcourse on acting for film and Shakespeare at Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London. Although her original goal was to be an actor, Casey has had the privilege of working as a crew member in the hair and makeup department on various film sets for the last 15 years. Most recently, Casey worked in the makeup department on The Last Starlet (Mississippian Stella Stevens Biopic), The Movers, Sunday Kinda Love, The System, and This Bloody Country (filmed in Utah). Some of her favorite projects to work on over the past couple of years have been the "Visit Mississippi" ad campaigns, tying together her love of film, travel, and Mississippi. Besides working in film, Casey also co-directs a high school drama program at East Rankin Academy and dabbles in the travel industry. Being raised by a writer and a librarian naturally means a love of storytelling is in her blood. She hopes she can be instrumental in the state's growing industry and in helping Mississippi stories get told.

Robbie Fisher is a film producer and attorney based in Water Valley, Mississippi. She is the owner of Fisher Productions, LLC and has served on the boards of OxFilm and the Crossroads Film Society. She has served as a juror for the Oxford Film Festival.

Fisher has produced award-winning documentaries and a number of short narrative films in Mississippi, including Going Toward Love, Delta Blind Spot and Headrush, and Sequence. Fisher has also produced commercials and worked on feature films in Mississippi including As I Lay Dying and Starve and served as the Line Producer on Thrasher Road and Mysterious Circumstance: The Death of Meriwether Lewis.
